Questions about remigration?

The Netherlands Migration Institute provides, on request of the Dutch Government, information about the Remigration Act and advises and assists those thinking about returning to their country of origin. Call (030) 236 42 45 for information or to book an appointment with one of our advisors. The NMI can be visited on 11 different locations throughout the country. NMI provides its services for free.



Do you consider to return to your country of origin?

NMI is ready to assist you. Our advisors can help you with all kind of questions you might have related to your voluntary return to your country of origin.

Our advisors can help you with questions regarding residence permits, benefits (and the possibility exporting them), pensions, insurances, guardianship, debts and taxes as well as special benefits for remigration provided by the Remigration Act.

It might be that you are entitled to provisions of the Remigration Act. Our advisors are able to inform you about the possibilities and assist you in making your application.

Everyone considering remigration can turn to the NMI for information, advice, guidance and support in preparing and handling the administrative aspects. Also after you remigration you can approach the NMI with questions concerning your remigration in relation to the Dutch legislation and regulations.

Services by NMI are provided for free and available in 11 different locations throughout the country.

The Remigration Act

The remigration act offers migrants from a limited number of countries an allowance to make it possible to return to their country of origin.

The remigration allowance is a monthly amount for your living costs.

To be eligible for the remigration allowance you need to:

- Be born and have or have held the nationality of Bosnia-Herzegovina, Greece, Italy, Cape Verde, Kosovo, Croatia, Macedonia, Morocco, Montenegro, Serbia (Federal Republic of Yugoslavia), Portugal, Slovenia, Spain, Surinam, Tunisia or Turkey, or
- Have lived in the Netherlands as a person with refugee status or as a person entitled to asylum, in that case your country of origin does not matter;
- Have come to the Netherlands after your 18th birthday;
- Have been legally living in the Netherlands for at least 8 years;
- Have been receiving a Dutch social benefit for at least a year immediately before submitting your application for the remigration allowance;
- Be at least 55 years old.

If you meet the criteria you must still comply with a number of conditions, the most important are:

- If you have a partner, your partner will accompany you;
- You and your partner are not in debt to the Dutch government, including outstanding taxes and unpaid fines. If you have debts you have arranged a repayment schedule;
- If you possess dual nationality you have to give up your Dutch nationality before leaving;
- If you possess only the Dutch nationality you need to be prepared to give up your Dutch nationality and apply for the nationality of the country you are moving to;
- If you are a refugee or entitled to asylum you need to have proof that you will be admitted to the country where you are going to live.
